

I was very excited when my book appeared on my Kindle. Unfortunately, I am a bit disappointed. Maybe I am just ready for the story to come to a conclusion. The writing is good as always, and you certainly feel like you are in the action by the author's descriptions. But some of it is starting to get old.. Running into the same villains, the same fights, the same decisions, same hand-wringing, etc. I would love to see the story take a completely unexpected turn... Will's change was one, but it looks like the ending will be predictable. Maybe a plot turn dealing with the science of the zombies or something.. I don't know. It's time to wrap it up, and unless the ending is going to be mind blowing, it looks like it will be pretty standard with good guy going to "the light" and girl saving the world with her memories of good guy... I don't know.. End it already.

O.K. Sammy Whammy, lets pick it up. After seven books I'm wondering if you are ever going to make it out of 2nd gear. Don't get me wrong; I have really enjoyed the ride but common' already! You're starting to sound like Adairs "Slow Burn" series which I finally gave up on. When are we going to start wrapping this up for the grand climax - Book 27 in the series?

I'm guessing that everybody else thought this was going to be the finale. After getting through 2/3rds of the book I realized it wasn't going to be. It is just more of the same. Get into a hopeless situation, somehow make it out and joke about sex. I feel like we are devolving into a daytime soap opera, where nothing really happens. The whole Mercer thing was just too unbelievable for even this series. The best thing about this book is that it relieved me of the need to see the next one.

I love this series and this author, but this was not my favorite installment. It felt like it was stalled, there were new developments, but in terms of advancing the story, not much. This story had way too much Keo, not enough of the core group we started this journey with. Frank needs to connect with Lara and get that part of the story moving. I have read every book in this series in record time, this one.....not so much. I will most definitely read the next and most likely everything this author publishes, but I'm hoping for more in the next one.

The writing was good, but I felt that the story revolves around Keo too much. I read the spin-offs about him, but I would like get back to the core events. His character's influence on the story gets to be a mood-killer. We still don't know where the *æghouls* originated from and we are on Book 7, nine if you grabbed the Keo spin-offs. I like the new complexity, but I felt this should have

been the finale. All secrets should have been revealed by now. I am on the fence about whether or not I will grab the next one.

Much like the last book, most of what happens in this installment is nothing but a distraction. Gaby, Nate, and Danny's adventure was almost unnecessary with the exception of one big battle. Other than that, you can skip the rest of their story line entirely and not miss much. Keo and Jordan's story is much the same but you'll have to trudge through that for one or two big developments. Lara and crew are still growing mold on a boat in the Gulf of Mexico. Character development has devolved into everyone becoming a version of Danny. Everyone is the same smart ass now. Aside from that, there's really not much progress in the main plot. I found myself skimming most of the book after about 30% or so. I was a huge fan when I first started this series but now I am looking forward to the conclusion.

Oh come on already Sam! Same old stuff... fighting losing battles and somehow coming out on top everytime. The constant fighting and shooting and stabbing and hiding and running have just really run the course with me. I wanted some answers! Where did the ghouls come from??! What was the "answer" to it that Will (Frank) has that will end it all?! I'm done. You have made fools out of all of us who have continued to buy the books in this series. You should have stopped being so greedy and wrapped it up. I'm not buying the next one.

For some reason, I thought this book would be the last book of the series so I was somewhat disappointed to find out that it wasn't. I thought the way book 6 ended that this book would tie up all of the loose ends, and we would learn the answers to how and why the purge started and who Mabry really is. I feel the same as other readers in that Sam Sisavath is stringing us along to sell his books because book 7 is more of the same with all of the characters fighting and escaping situations. Don't get me wrong. I have really enjoyed this series, but I do think it needs to come to an end. So please, Mr. Sisavath, I hope your next book will be it.
